Jesus and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit

There is no doubt about it—Easter is the most important day in the life of the Christian Community! Jesus conquered death. Jesus is the risen Lord. But what now? How in the world is the Christian believer supposed to live the life of faith in this broken world? The answer is Christ's promise to send the Holy Spirit into the lives of his followers. After Easter, the Community of Christ waited for Pentecost, when Christ poured out His Spirit on His church. The ministry of the Holy Spirit has many dimensions in our lives. 1 Corinthians 14 focuses on one dimension in particular—the "Gifts" of the Spirit through which we are able to minister to one another in the Body of Christ.

Charismatic Weirdness?

There is every indication that the Corinthians were practicing patterns of "ministry" and "worship" in their services that were out of line. In fact, what Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 14 is written specifically to correct them on these issues. Evidently they had elevated the gift of "tongues" to a place of special prominence and "spirituality." Paul writes to tell them that they are totally off base about this. Truth is, they were engaging in what might be labeled "charismatic weirdness." This is something that has been present in the church from the earliest days of the Christian faith and it is still with us even today! Before we use this as an excuse to show no interest in "charismatic" gifts of the Spirit (or worse yet to disdain them) we need to pay close attention to what Paul teaches in this chapter. Nowhere does Paul say that these gifts have ceased or that they are not real or valid. What he does do is put them into proper perspective for us. For example, he tells us that we should not "forbid" people from speaking in tongues, but that we should be more eager to use the gift of prophecy in the church, and that all things should be done in a fitting and orderly way (see 1 Corinthians 14:39-40).

Words that Strengthen, Encourage, and Comfort

The key to understanding chapter 14 (as well as the gifts of tongues and prophecy) is in verses 3-4. Paul's primary concern is that the community of faith will be strengthened, encouraged and comforted. This is the greatest need. Because this is the greatest need, the gifts that serve this purpose are to be most valued in the Community of Faith. Prophecy is the gift of the Spirit that most directly and consistently does these things. But the gift of tongues is primarily used for personal experience in worship. That's why Paul wants them to focus on Prophesy more than tongues. In the course of this discussion we learn lots of important things about Spiritual gifts.

Important Things Every Christian Should Know about Spiritual Gifts

- Every Christian should desire Spiritual Gifts. (12: 7; 14:1)
- God gives the gifts according to His own sovereign will and purpose. (12:11)
- Every gift is important and has its place, even tongues. (12:7-11; 14:4&39)
- The timing, use and expression of Spiritual Gifts is at the discretion of the individual—it's never about "loosing control" because you are under the power of the Spirit. (14:26-32)
- Our use of the gifts is "imperfect" and therefore we need to be careful, "critical" and discerning in our reception and response when on the receiving end of someone's use of their "gift". (14:29)
- The strengthening, encouragement and comfort of other believers is the ultimate goal. (14:3)
- All things must be done in a fitting and orderly way! (14:39-40)

May the Lord bless each of our lives with the Gifts of His Spirit in such a way that we are able to strengthen, encourage and comfort one another in our Christian life and faith! All to His Glory!
